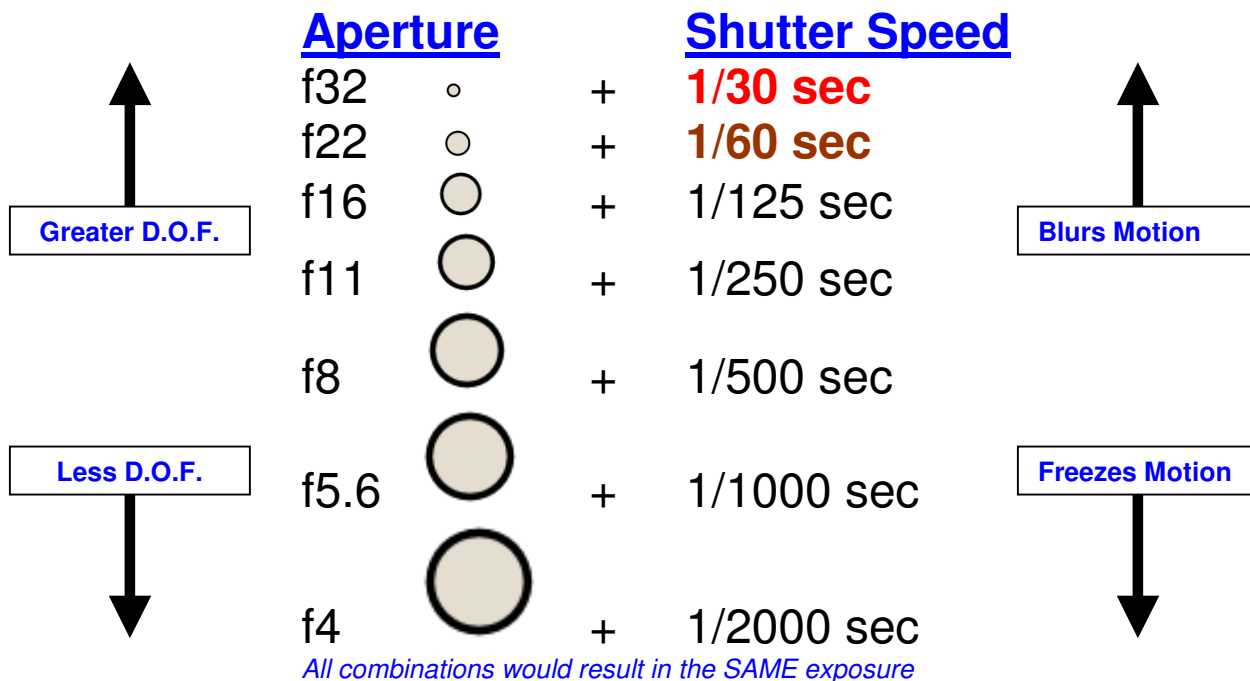
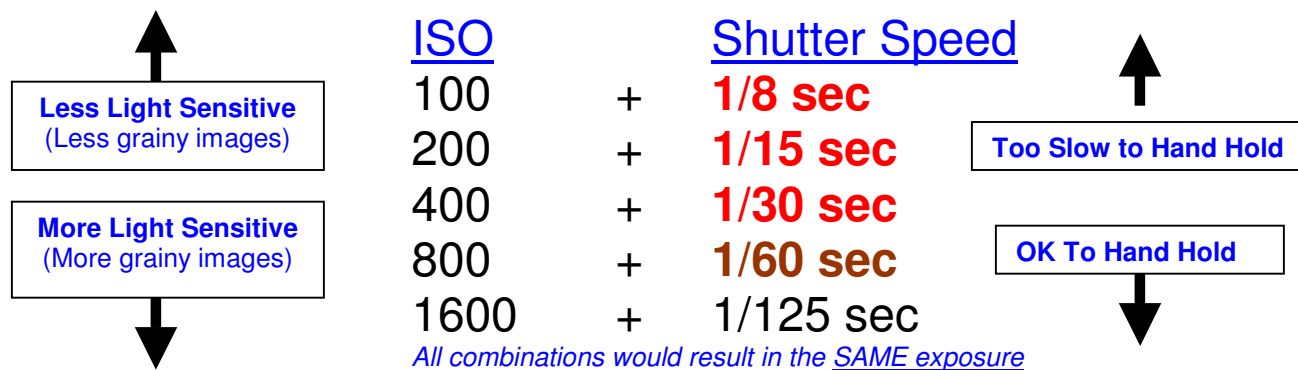


Putting It All Together

- Use the aperture to control the depth of field (DOF).
- Use the shutter speed to control the amount of motion blur created by movement of the subject or shaking of your hand.



Use the ISO to adjust the camera's sensitivity to light allowing you to use faster shutter speeds in lower light conditions.



Red = Indicates a shutter speed that may be too slow to hand hold. Generally, the slowest shutter speed you can hand hold depends on the focal length of your lens.

Examples:

- ❑ If lens focal length = 35mm then use shutter speed > 1/35 second
- ❑ If lens focal length = 100mm then use shutter speed > 1/100 second
- ❑ If lens focal length = 135mm then use shutter speed > 1/135 second

Very slow shutter speeds require a tripod to prevent a blurred image.
